Use the device only as described in this user manual. Any other use or use under other operating conditions is considered to be improper and may result in personal injury or property damage. No liability will be assumed for damages resulting from improper use.

This device may be used only by persons with sufficient physical, sensorial, and intellectual abilities and having corresponding knowledge and experience. Other persons may use this device only if they are supervised or instructed by a person who is responsible for their safety.

Extend the operating life of the device by regular breaks and by avoiding frequent switching on and off. The device is not suitable for continuous operation.

# Danger for children



# NOTICE!

### **Risk of fire**

Do not block areas of ventilation. Do not install the device near any direct heat source. Keep the device away from naked flames.

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#### **Operating conditions**

This device has been designed for indoor use only. To prevent damage, never expose the device to any liquid or moisture. Avoid direct sunlight, heavy dirt, and strong vibrations.

Only operate the device within the ambient conditions specified in the chapter 'Technical specifications' of this user manual. Avoid heavy temperature fluctuations and do not switch the device on immediately after it was exposed to temperature fluctuations (for example after transport at low outside temperatures).

Dust and dirt inside can damage the unit. When operated in harmful ambient conditions (dust, smoke, nicotine, fog, etc.), the unit should be maintained by qualified service personnel at regular intervals to prevent overheating and other malfunction.

The device must not be moved during use.



#### Power supply

Before connecting the device, ensure that the input voltage (AC outlet) matches the voltage rating of the device and that the AC outlet is protected by a residual current circuit breaker. Failure to do so could result in damage to the device and possibly injure the user.

Unplug the device before electrical storms occur and when it is unused for long periods of time to reduce the risk of electric shock or fire.



### NOTICE!

#### **Possible staining**

The plasticiser contained in the rubber feet of this product may possibly react with the coating of your parquet, linoleum, laminate or PVC floor and after some time cause permanent dark stains.

In case of doubt, do not put the rubber feet directly on the floor, but use felt-pad floor protectors or a carpet.

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## Possible damage due to installation of a wrong fuse

The use of different types of fuses can cause serious damage to the unit. Fire hazard!

Only fuses of the same type may be used.



# 3 Features

The moving head is particularly suitable for professional lighting tasks, for example at events, on rock stages, in theatres and musicals, in nightclubs as well as for mobile DJs and enter-tainer.

Special features of the device:

- Two movable axles with 8 or 16 bit resolution:
  - Tilt (180°)
  - Pan (540°)
- Pan and Tilt invertible
- 4 × 10 W Quad Colour RGBW LEDs
- Control via DMX (4, 9, 14 or 26 channels) and via buttons and display on the unit
- 9 preprogrammed automatic shows
- Sound control
- Electronic dimmer 0 %...100 %
- Zoom function 10°...60°
- Shutter frequency 0...20 Hz
- Omega bracket and infrared remote control included

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For technological reasons, the light output of LEDs decreases over their lifetime. This effect increases with higher operating temperature. You can extend the service life of the illuminants by providing adequate ventilation and operating the LEDs with the lowest possible brightness.



# 4 Installation

Unpack and check carefully there is no transportation damage before using the unit. Keep the equipment packaging. To fully protect the product against vibration, dust and moisture during transportation or storage use the original packaging or your own packaging material suitable for transport or storage, respectively.

### NOTICE!

#### **Risk of overheating**

The distance between light output and the illuminated surface must be more than 1.5 m (19.7in).

Provide sufficient ventilation.

The ambient temperature must always be below 40 °C (104 °F).



#### Possible damage caused by movements of the device

Always ensure that enough space is free around the device for the movements of the head (pan, tilt).

#### NOTICE!

### Possible data transmission errors

For error-free operation make use of dedicated DMX cables and do not use ordinary microphone cables.

Never connect the DMX input or output to audio devices such as mixers or amplifiers.

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Please note that this device must not be connected to a dimmer.

#### **Mounting options**

You can install the device on the ceiling or on the floor.

The threads on the housing bottom are used to secure the supplied Omega bracket or truss clamps.




# 5 Starting up

Create all connections while the device is off. Use the shortest possible high-quality cables for all connections. Take care when running the cables to prevent tripping hazards.




#### **Connections in DMX mode**

Connect the DMX input of the device to the DMX output of a DMX controller or another DMX device. Connect the output of the first DMX device to the input of the second one, and so on to form a daisy chain. Always ensure that the output of the last DMX device in the daisy chain is terminated with a resistor (110  $\Omega$ , ¼ W).

# 7 Operating

# 7.1 Starting the device



# CAUTION!

#### Risk of injury due to movements of the device

The head of the device can move quickly (pan, tilt) and can produce very bright light. This is also valid immediately after you turn on the device, when the device operates in automatic mode or under remote control and when you turn off a DMX controller that is connected to the device. Persons staying near the device could be injured or frightened.


Before you turn on the device and during the operation, always ensure that nobody stays close to the device. If work has to be performed in the area of movement or in the near vicinity of the device, it must remain turned off.

Connect the device to the power supply to start operation. After a few seconds, the fans start to work, the head moves to the home positions for rotation (pan) and inclination (tilt). After some more seconds, 'Addr:XXX NoSignal' is flashing in the display. The device is now operational.



# 7.2 Function selection

Press repeatedly [DOWN] while 'A001' is flashing in the display to call up one of nine preprogrammed scenes, one of nine programmes or to set the device to sound-controlled mode.



# 7.2.1 DMX menu

Press [ENTER] while 'Addr:XXX NoSignal' is flashing in the display to select the DMX menu. Press [ENTER] to call up the first menu item.



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#### **DMX address**

The display shows 'DMX Addr'. Press [ENTER] to then select with [UP] and [DOWN] the first DMX channel to be used by the device (DMX address) in a range from 001 to max. 509.

When the display shows the desired value press [ENTER] to save the setting and then [DOWN] to change to the next menu item. To change the menu item without making any changes, press [MODE].

Make sure that this number matches the configuration of your DMX controller. The following table shows the highest possible DMX address for the various DMX modes.

4 channels	509
9 channels	504
14 channels	499
26 channels	487



Selecting the number of DMX channels	The display shows <i>'Channels Select'</i> . Press <i>[ENTER]</i> to then select with <i>[UP]</i> and <i>[DOWN]</i> the number of DMX channels to be used by the device. Control via 4, 9, 14 or 26 channels is available.
	When the display shows the desired value press [ENTER] to save the setting and then [DOWN] to change to the next menu item. To change the menu item without making any changes, press [MODE].
DMX break	The display shows 'DMX Break'. Press [ENTER] to then select with [UP] and [DOWN] one of the options for the behaviour of the device in case the DMX connection is interrupted. Choose 'Hold' if you want the device in that case to maintain the state that corresponds to the last received DMX signal. Choose 'Hold' if you want the device in that case to perform an automatic run. Choose 'Sound' if you want the device in that case to perform a sound-controlled automatic run. Choose 'Sound' if you want the device in that case to return to its home position.
	When the display shows the desired value press [ENTER] to save the setting and then [MODE] twice to return to the function selection. To change the menu item without making any changes, press [MODE].



### 7.2.2 Scene menu

Press [DOWN] while 'Addr:XXX NoSignal' is flashing in the display to select the scene 'Red Alone'. Press [ENTER] twice to open the Scene menu and to change scene parameters as desired.

With [UP] and [DOWN] you can select the menu items explained in the following table; press ENTER to call up the respectively connected function. Use [UP] and [DOWN] to change the respectively indicated value. When the display shows the desired value press [ENTER] to save the settings. With [MODE], you get to the parent menu level.


Any 'Strobe' setting except '0' overrides settings 'Strobe1–4' for individual LEDs.

If you have left the menu and 'Red Alone' is displayed again, press [DOWN] to consecutively select the scenes 'Green Alone', 'Blue Alone', 'White Alone', 'Yellow Alone', 'Cyan Alone', 'Purple Alone', 'Red Alone' and 'AllWhite Alone' which you can change as described.



### 7.2.3 Programme menu

Press repeatedly [DOWN] while 'Addr:XXX NoSignal' is flashing in the display to select one of the 9 preprogrammed shows 'Prog 1' to 'Prog 9'. Press [ENTER] twice to open the Programme menu and to change show parameters as desired.



Speed

The display shows 'Speed'. Press [ENTER] to then select with [UP] and [DOWN] a value between 000 and 255 for the process speed of the show.

When the display shows the desired value press [ENTER] to save the settings. To change the menu item without making any changes, press [MODE].



Dimmer	Press [DOWN]. The display shows <i>'Dimmer'</i> . Press [ENTER] to then select with [UP] and [DOWN] a value between 000 and 255 for the light intensity of the show.		
	When the display shows the desired value press [ENTER] to save the settings. To change the menu item without making any changes, press [MODE].		
Strobe	Press [DOWN]. The display shows 'Strobe'. Press [ENTER] to then select with [UP] and [DOWN] a value between 010 and 255 for the strobe frequency of the show. Values between 000 and 009 have no function here.		
	When the display shows the desired value press [ENTER] to save the settings. To change the menu item without making any changes, press [MODE]. Press [MODE] twice to return to the function selection.		

### 7.3 Settings menu

In this menu you can configure the device according your liking. All previous settings are retained even when you switch the device off and disconnect it from the mains. Press [MODE] and confirm with [ENTER] to open the settings menu 'Set Menu'.



Resetting to factory defaults	Press <i>[ENTER]</i> to call up the first menu item <i>'Reload Default'</i> . With this function, you can reset the device to its factory default setting. All your previously adjusted settings are thereby irre-trievably erased.
	If you want to enable this function use [UP] and [DOWN] to select 'ON' and confirm with [ENTER]. If you want to disable this function use [UP] and [DOWN] to select 'OFF' and confirm with [ENTER].
Reset Machine	Press, if necessary repeatedly, [DOWN] and confirm with [ENTER] to call up the menu item ' <i>Reset Machine'</i> . Use this function to reset positions and colours to their respective pro- grammed parameters.
	If you want to execute this function use [UP] and [DOWN] to select 'ON' and confirm with [ENTER]. If you do not want to execute this function select 'OFF' and confirm with [ENTER].
Master and Stand-alone opera- tion	Press, if necessary repeatedly, [DOWN] and confirm with [ENTER] to call up the menu item 'Master & Alone'. Use this function to specify whether the device operates as 'Master' and con- trols other units, or works in 'Stand-alone' mode.
	Use [UP] and [DOWN] to select the desired function and confirm with [ENTER].



Auto and Sound	Press, if necessary repeatedly, [DOWN] and confirm with [ENTER] to call up the menu item 'Auto & Sound'. Use this function to specify whether the device operates in Auto mode or sound-controlled.		
	Use [UP] and [DOWN] to select the desired function and confirm with [ENTER].		
Microphone sensitivity	Press, if necessary repeatedly, [DOWN] and confirm with [ENTER] to call up the menu item 'MICSense'. Use this function to specify the sensitivity of the built-in microphone for sound-control.		
	Use [UP] and [DOWN] to select the desired sensitivity and confirm with [ENTER].		
Clear Display	Press, if necessary repeatedly, [DOWN] and confirm with [ENTER] to call up the menu item 'Clear Display'. Use this function to specify whether you want the display to be always bright or if it should dim out after approx. 25 seconds. When the display is dimmed, press any button to restore full illumination.		
	Use [UP] and [DOWN] to select 'Always On' if the display should always light up bright. Choose 'Delay Off' if the display should dim out after approx. 25 seconds. Confirm with [ENTER].		



Key Lock	Press, if necessary repeatedly, [DOWN] and confirm with [ENTER] to call up the menu item 'Key Lock'. Use this function to specify whether the buttons on the device are automatically locked against unintentional operation 30 seconds after the last operation. Use [UP] and [DOWN] to select 'Lock: On' if the buttons should get locked. Select 'Lock: Off' if the buttons should not get locked. Confirm with [ENTER].
	O To unlock the buttons during operation for 30 seconds, press [MODE], [DOWN], [UP]   Image: Second state of the button second
Information	Press, if necessary repeatedly, [DOWN] and confirm with [ENTER] to call up the menu item 'Information'.
	Use [UP] and [DOWN] to display information about manufacturer, model no., and date and time of production. Press [ENTER] to return to the parent menu level.



Operating hours counter	Press, if necessary repeatedly, [DOWN] and confirm with [ENTER] to call up the menu item 'Machine Timer'.
	The display shows <i>'ThisTime'</i> . Press <i>[ENTER]</i> to display the time since the last power-up. An 'M' behind the numerical value stands for minutes, an 'H' stands for hours. Press <i>[ENTER]</i> to clear the display.
	Press [DOWN]. The display shows 'TotlTime'. Press [ENTER] to display the entire elapsed oper- ating hours. Press [ENTER] to clear the display.
	Press [DOWN]. The display shows 'ClearTotal'. Press [ENTER] and use [UP] and [DOWN] to enter the password to delete the entire elapsed operating time. Upon delivery, the password is '001'. The display shows 'ClearTotal:No'. Press [UP] or [DOWN] to set the display to 'ClearTotal:OK'. Press [ENTER] to delete the entire elapsed operating hours.
	Press, if necessary repeatedly, [MODE] until the display shows 'Machine Timer' again.



Motor Set	Press, if necessary repeatedly, [DOWN] and confirm with [ENTER] to call up the menu item 'Motor Set'. This function allows you to specify whether the LEDs light up in DMX mode during the movements of the device head or during zooming, or not.
	The display shows 'Motor Set'. Press [ENTER] to select the function 'Move Blackout' and confirm with [ENTER]. Then use [UP] or [DOWN] to select 'ON' and press [ENTER] to enable this function (LEDs 'off' on DMX-controlled movements). Select 'OFF' and press [ENTER] to disable this function (LEDs 'on' on DMX-controlled movements).
	Press, if necessary repeatedly, [MODE] until the display shows 'Motor Set' again.
Inverting Pan / Tilt	Press, if necessary repeatedly, [DOWN] and confirm with [ENTER] to call up the menu item 'Motor Set'. This function allows you to invert the Pan and Tilt movement direction.
	The display shows 'Motor Set'. Confirm with [ENTER]. Press [UP] or [DOWN] until the display shows 'Motor Calibrate'. Confirm with [ENTER]. Now you can use [UP] or [DOWN] to choose between 'Pan Motor' (reversing the direction of rotation) and 'Tilt Motor' (reversing the direction of inclination). Press [ENTER] when the desired option is displayed and then press [UP] or [DOWN] until the display shows 'Reverse'. Confirm with [ENTER]. Use [UP] or [DOWN] to select 'Yes' to reverse the direction, or 'No' to not reverse the direction. Confirm with [ENTER].



#### **Recording scenes**

Press, if necessary repeatedly, [DOWN] and confirm with [ENTER] to call up the menu item 'Record Scene'. Here you can assign the scene currently performed by the device to one of 8 memory locations for the scenes 'Red', 'Green', 'Blue', 'White', 'Yellow', 'Cyan', 'Purple' and 'AllWhite'.

Press [ENTER] and use [UP] and [DOWN] to select the desired memory location. Press [ENTER] and use [UP] and [DOWN] to select 'Yes'. Confirm with [ENTER] to save the scene. This will overwrite the previously saved parameters for this scene.

Press, if necessary repeatedly, [MODE] until the display shows 'Record Scene' again.



#### Advanced menu

Press, if necessary repeatedly, [DOWN] and confirm with [ENTER] to call up the menu item 'Advance Menu'. Here you can change the password that protects the access to some menu options to prevent unauthorized access. The display shows 'Warning'.

Press [UP] or [DOWN] and confirm with [ENTER] to call up the menu item 'PassWordManage'. Keep [DOWN] pressed until PUK Code '638' is displayed. Press 'ENTER'. The display shows 'Modify P.W.'. Confirm with [ENTER]. The display shows the current password. Use [UP] and [DOWN] to select a new password and press 'ENTER' to save it.

Press repeatedly [MODE] to return to the respectively parent menu level or to leave the menu.



If you have entered an incorrect PUK code 'PassWord Err!!!' is flashing three times in the display. Then enter the correct PUK code.



## 8 Remote control



To use the remote control, point its infrared diode at the infrared sensor on the unit and press the desired buttons. The maximum operating distance is about 9 m. The device will only respond to the remote control signals if it is not controlled via DMX.

To enable the operation via remote control, press [STAND BY] on the remote control uand then [FULL ON].

#### 1 [STAND BY]

Stops the automatic mode and blackouts the unit. The display shows 'Stop'. In this mode, the device responds to the remote control.

2 [Dimmer + / -]

Adjusts the light intensity between 0 and 100%. Press [Dimmer +] repeatedly or keep the button pressed to increase the light intensity. Press [Dimmer–] repeatedly or keep the button pressed to decrease the light intensity.

3 [SOUND OFF]

Deactivates the sound-control.

4	[SHOW]

To call up one of the 9 preprogrammed automatic shows, press this button followed by the number button 1 – 9 for the desired show. To cancel a show, press [STAND BY].

5 [SOUND ON]

Activates the sound-control.

6 Number buttons

These buttons allow you to trim the rotation (X) and tilt (Y) of the device head:

Button 1: X– & Y+	Button 4: X–	Button 7: X– & Y–
Button 2: Y+	Button 5: Centre	Button 8: Y-
Button 3: X+ & Y+	Button 6: X+	Button 9: X+ & Y-

7 [STROBE]


Enables the Strobe function for the current light scene. Then press one of the number buttons 2 – 9 for the desired strobe frequency. Press number button 1 to turn the Strobe function off.



## 10 Plug and connection assignments

#### Introduction

This chapter will help you select the right cables and plugs to connect your valuable equipment so that a perfect light experience is guaranteed.

Please take our tips, because especially in 'Sound & Light' caution is indicated: Even if a plug fits into a socket, the result of an incorrect connection may be a destroyed DMX controller, a short circuit or 'just' a not working light show!

#### **DMX connections**

The unit offers a 3-pin XLR socket for DMX output and a 3-pin XLR plug for DMX input. Please refer to the drawing and table below for the pin assignment of a suitable XLR plug.

# 11 Troubleshooting

### NOTICE!

#### Possible data transmission errors

For error-free operation make use of dedicated DMX cables and do not use ordinary microphone cables.

Never connect the DMX input or output to audio devices such as mixers or amplifiers.

In the following we list a few common problems that may occur during operation. We give you some suggestions for easy troubleshooting:

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Symptom	Remedy
The unit does not work, no light, the fan does not run	Check the mains connection and the main fuse.
No response to the DMX con- troller	1. Check the DMX connectors and cables for proper connection.
	2. Check the address settings and the DMX polarity.
	3. Try using another DMX controller.
	4. Check to see if the DMX cables run near or alongside to high voltage cables that may cause damage or inter- ference to DMX interface circuits.

## 12 Cleaning

#### **Optical lenses**

Clean the optical lenses, that are accessible from the outside, regularly in order to optimize the light output. The frequency of cleaning depends on the operating environment: wet, smoky or particularly dirty surroundings can cause more accumulation of dirt on the optics of the device.

- Clean with a soft cloth using our lamp and lens cleaner (item no. 280122).
- Always dry the parts carefully.

#### **Fan grids**

The fan grids of the device must be cleaned of any contamination, such as dust, etc. on a regular basis. Before cleaning, switch off the device and disconnect mains-operated devices from the mains. Only use pH-neutral, solvent-free and non-abrasive cleaning agents. Clean the unit with a slightly damp lint-free cloth.
